CFAY Hosts a Base Historical Tour

YOKOSUKA, Japan (NNS) – Commander, Fleet Activities Yokosuka (CFAY) hosted several members of the Yokosuka Tourism Association for a base historical tour Oct. 3. The tour was split into three groups in order to adhere to HPCON B measures and social distancing guidelines.

cancel earlier tours this year. This tour brought guests to CFAY's historic dry docks, the CPO Club, and base headquarters buildings.

"We usually don't have the opportunity to enter the base, so I applied to go on this tour with my parents," said Kousuke Funakoshi, a local fourth grade elementary school student. "It was exciting to learn a little of the base's history. I think it's great that the dry docks are still in use, as it has been such a long time since they were built."



"I live here in Yokosuka, and I wanted to know the history of the base," said Takashi Yokoyama, one of the members of the tour group. "I participated in one of the tours three or four years ago, and got to go to the food court. Unfortunately, that isn't the case this time (due to COVID-19). I wish to come out and tour the base again when the pandemic is over and things get back to normal."

CFAY's first dry dock was built in 1871, and all of the installation's dry docks are still used to this day.

"It was great seeing the dry dock up close," said Katunori Kimura, another member of the tour group. "We can typically see the dry docks during open base events, but this time we got a tour guide. It was very helpful to hear about its history."

As HPCON measures allow for less restrictions in a post-COVID-19 environment, CFAY intends to host similar tours in the future.

For 75 years, CFAY has provided, maintained, and operated base facilities and services in support of the U.S. 7th Fleet's forward-deployed naval forces, tenant commands, and thousands of military and civilian personnel and their families.



UPDATE TO THE MASK WEARING GUIDANCE



Mask use is not required when working in an office individually. Mask must be donned when additional personnel enter an individual's office.



Masks with valves facilitate exhalation through the mask and decrease efficacy. Masks with valves are prohibited.



Neck fleece and bandanas are less effective in reducing respiration and voice associated particles and shall not be worn.



Do not lower your mask when speaking. This defeats the protective purpose of mask wear.



Destructive winds are winds of 50 knots sustained or gust factors of 60 knots or greater

Destructive winds are possible within 96 hours

Destructive winds are possible within 72 hours

A thunderstorm with winds under 39 MPH

One nautical mile per hour

A mile based on the circumference of the earth

Family Partner Program (FPP)

What is the FPP: A Command Ombudsman program to help Active Duty families with children accomplish essential tasks while mitigating the risk and exposure to COVID-19. It allows Two households to partner together to perform essential tasks that are often restraining due to the SIP (Shelter-in-Place) Policy.

*** Essential tasks are limited to: Visits to Commissary and NEX for essential items, Post Office pick up and drop off, essential medical and business appointments (Doctors, Veterinarian, VRO, auto port, other essential appointments).

*** Family Partner Program is NOT to be used for: Scheduling play dates, coffee visits or any other non-essential task.



Who is eligible:

1. Spouse of Active Duty Personnel with any dependent children aged fifteen years or younger AND your active duty spouse is deployed, TAD.
2. Single Active Duty with any dependent children aged fifteen years or younger.
3. Spouse of an Active Duty Personnel who does not have dependent children aged fifteen years or younger and partnering with a family.

How to Apply: Contact your command Ombudsman or go to the FFSC Yokosuka Japan Facebook Page (<https://www.facebook.com/ffscyokosukajapan/>) to get a FPP form to complete and submit to your Ombudsman.

Computer Desktop Notification System (CDNS)

CDNS is short for Computer Desktop Notification System. CDNS is the system used by shore commands to provide simultaneous emergency notifications to OneNet computer desktops, as well as home, work and mobile email and telephones.






Fall 2020 HVAC Changeover



In support of Navy/National Energy policies and completion of preventative maintenance, Fleet Activities Yokosuka maintains an HVAC changeover period as follows:

- Cooling shutoff: No sooner than **19 October**
- Heating turn-on: No later than **20 November**
- Expect four weeks of no heating/cooling.
- Heating turn-off/AC turn-on order of operations:



- Users are advised to open doors and windows as needed and to use natural ventilation to the maximum extent possible.
- If you have a user controlled unit in your space, you are required by CNIC policy and COMFLEACTYOKOSUKAINST 11300.2H to secure your heating at the time period listed above.
- Dates are estimates in anticipation of average weather and may vary slightly due to actual weather conditions and/or PMI schedule availability.


BEYOND THE GATE

Main base, Ikego and off base residents are now authorized to travel throughout the Kanagawa prefecture. Yokohama, Kawasaki and Tokyo areas remain off limits. Below are some areas that can be used for exercise and enjoying fresh air while physically distancing:



Kurihama Flower Park

25-minute drive from Yokosuka's Main Base
Kurihama Flower Park is a Yokosuka City park located about a 15-minute walk from either the JR Kurihama Station or Keikyu Kurihama Station. This luxuriant park utilizes the natural terrain and features seasonal flowers throughout the year, such as poppies in the spring and cosmos in the fall. The park also offers playgrounds for children.



Umikaze Park


5-minute drive from Yokosuka's Main Base
Umikaze Park offers a spacious lawn with plenty of room for walking or running. Sitting on the grass and looking at the sea leisurely is also an option as a viewing area for Sarushima (Monkey Island).



Mikasa Park

5-minute walk from Yokosuka's Main Base

Mikasa Park grants visitors a great space to run, walk and play while viewing beautiful fountains and waterfront. There are numerous walking paths to enjoy that overlook the bay as well as lots of grassy areas and play areas for children. The park also offers water shows and light shows that can be viewed while physically distancing.
